

CV Sigmund Loland

Sigmund Loland is a professor of sports philosophy and sports ethics at the Department of Sport and Social Sciences, Norwegian School of Sport Sciences (NIH). Dr. Loland has published extensively in the area of sports ethics and philosophy with a particular emphasis on the ethics of performance-enhancing technology and doping, epistemology of movement and the theory of the sport sciences, and eco-philosophical perspectives on sport. He has been a Visiting Scholar at several universities, including Stanford University in 1993 and the University of Southern California from 2014 to 2016. From 2019 to 2022, he was a Guest Professor at the Swedish School of Sport and Health Sciences. Dr. Loland has held several academic leadership positions. He is a former Rector at NIH (2005-13), a former Board Member and President of the International Association for the Philosophy of Sport (IAPS) (2000-03), and a former Board Member and President of the European College of Sport Science (ECSS) (2006-13). Dr. Loland is a member of WADA's Ethics Committee (2004-) and of the Research Committee at the IOC Olympic Studies Centre (2013-), and he is a supervising professor at The International Olympic Academy in Olympia, Greece (2001-). Dr. Loland has received several awards for his research and teaching, including the IAPS Distinguished Scholar Award (2009). He is an International Fellow at the American Academy of Kinesiology and Physical Education (2004-). In 2017 he held an 'Olympic Chair' (Guest Professorate) at the Universities of Leuven and Ghent, Belgium.
